Target Groups: Doctoral and postdoctoral researchers from all EUGLOH member institutions and from all disciplines, working on a research project related to global health; maximum size

of the group: 40 PhDs

ECTS/Certificate: 3 ECTS and a Certificate of Attendance will be issued for those who actively participate and attend the full event (virtual <u>and</u> physical part)

Content

Career planning during the doctoral phase is tricky – focusing on research is highly demanding, planning what comes next in time is equally challenging. The rise of the seemingly ultimate question "Should I stay or should I go?" may trigger uncertainty about both one's competencies and requirements for future steps.

This EUGLOH activity focuses 1) on transversal skills that PhD researchers gain throughout their journey and 2) on various ways in which science can have societal impact – by actors both inside and outside of universities. For this purpose, you will work on your individual competence profile, learn about research communication and explore sciencepreneurship.

The Erasmus+ Blended Intensive Program (BIP) takes place both virtually and physically. The virtual component provides innovative presentation tools and enables international PhDs to present their research projects. The physical part in Hamburg offers workshops with various experts to prepare PhDs for career paths in and beyond academia. You will identify and develop skills for making an impact – be it political, educational, cultural, economic, or social – in the field of global health.

Activities and Learning Objectives

- **Train your pitch:** Refine your presentation skills by 3MT presentations (<u>HRA Research</u> Communication Project in cooperation with U.Porto 3MT®)
- **Build your competence profile:** Reflect your skills and competences that you gain throughout your PhD (based on <u>EU ResearchComp</u>)
- **Engage with publics:** Learn to communicate your research to a wider audience (in cooperation with city2science)
- **Reflect your skill set as a sciencepreneur:** Discover what it means to become an innovator (in cooperation with YES Young Entrepreneurs in Science @ Falling Walls Foundation)





Application process

- 1) Candidates are obliged to check the availability of Erasmus+ BIP grants at their home institution <u>before</u> applying to the program!
- 2) Candidates applying for the program must provide the following documents:
 - Short CV (1-2 pages)
 - Short abstract of the PhD research project, particularly related to the Global Health approach of the European University Alliance for Global Health (EUGLOH) and described in a generally understandable way for a non-specialist election committee (max. 300 words)
 - Motivation letter with reference to at least one of the BIP focus topics or activities (max. 200 words)

Deadline for applications: 7 July 2024

If more eligible candidates apply than there are places available, the organizing consortium will select on the basis of academic merit, congruency to the program objectives and a targeted equal distribution between EUGLOH partners.

Successful applicants will be informed by mid-July to plan their stay in Hamburg in good time.

Please note: Participants are responsible for organizing their journey and stay. Participants cover travel, accommodation and all other costs from the Erasmus+ grant.
